As part of these we questioned top chef **Hugh Fearnley-Whittingstall** and also spent a fascinating morning at **Fareshare**, (pic left) a charity based in Deptford, that redistributes surplus food. It collects from supermarkets and coffee shop chains and gives to foodbanks, homeless hostels and breakfast clubs.

Welcomed my local **Business Club** to Westminster to hear George Osborne's recollections about the Brexit campaign and the Cameron era.
