Visited **Saundersfoot School** (*pic left*) where I toured their outdoor learning classroom and met their school ambassadors who greatly impressed me with their maturity, wit and good manners.

Held discussions with **Tenby GP Surgery** to learn how they are tackling waiting times and recruitment issues; enjoyed watching the **new Mayor of Carmarthen** being installed, and was deafened by the **Vintage Hot Rods at Pendine Sands**.

Successfully lobbied the Welsh Assembly Government to ensure that the newly planted **roundabouts at Carew and Sageston** are properly maintained.

The **Long Course weekend** has become a highlight of the summer calendar, welcoming thousands of visitors to the area. I was out on the course manning the water station at Templeton as well as attending the festivities at the finish in Tenby to see

various friends and relations over the line - a big thanks to **Activity Wales** for showcasing the county in such style!

Set up a meeting with the National Trust, Welsh Water, Carmarthenshire County Council and Natural Resources Wales to discuss the

protection of Morfa Bychan near Pendine. (*pic right*) Illegal camping and fly tipping are blighting this beautiful bay and it will take a joined-up approach to solve the problem.

Festival, (*pic left*) the result of the hard work of the whole community and created in the memory of the Rector of St Teilo's, Griffith Jones. It is the 300th anniversary of him becoming Rector and setting up the circulating schools that brought basic education to the rural population.



In Westminster I have:

Taken part in **Environment, Food & Rural Affairs (EFRA) Select Committee** hearings into the welfare of domestic animals, where we have taken evidence from the RSPCA, Chief Inspectors, leading animal charities and council leaders amongst others. The Committee is also conducting an ongoing inquiry into the issue of flooding.

Attended a discussion event (*pic right*) on the **issue of domestic violence** that was **hosted by Radio4** and was sparked by the 'Helen and Rob' storyline in the Archers about coercive control.



Met the extraordinary 86-year-old **Zigi Shipper** (*pic left*) who was sent to **Auschwitz at 14** and told us his story without a hint of bitterness. Thank you to the Holocaust Educational Trust for ensuring we never forget.

Hosted a debate in the House of Commons Chamber alongside Maria Miller MP, highlighting the increasing **issue of online abuse and bullying**.

Our debate attracted cross party support and focused on a broad range of issues, including the role that social media platforms (e.g. Facebook, Twitter, Youtube etc) have to play and whether they are accepting sufficient responsibility for their role.

Met **S4C Chief Executive Ian Jones** to discuss the future of the channel and its forthcoming move to Carmarthen.



I confess to not knowing we had a world leading author of children's colouring books based here in Tenby. [Millie Marotta](#) (*pic right*) has sold over 6 million copies of her work at home and abroad and was Amazon's second best seller!

Increasingly parents are looking for some 'non-digital' activity for their children these days, and Millie's beautiful and intricate drawings are ideal. It was a real pleasure welcoming her to Westminster to talk about the arts being such an important UK export and how our rules on intellectual property rights have helped protect her and authors like her.
