Supporting local campaigns. This is a key element of my role and over 60 people attended my public


meeting for the **campaign against a new-build primary school in Tenby**. I have also supported safety measures for a **dangerous junction in Red Roses**, lobbied

Held a meeting with the new Culture Secretary, Sajid Javid MP, to talk about the upcoming move of S4C to their new headquarters in



Carmarthen. Sajid really understands the importance of the Welsh language and is determined to help ensure this is a success.

Spoken in a debate outlining the **importance of outdoor sport and** recreation for people of all ages, but particularly for children. During a **debate on UK media** I highlighted the need for local events, such as Ironman Wales, to get more coverage.
