Here in Pembrokeshire and Carmarthenshire I have:

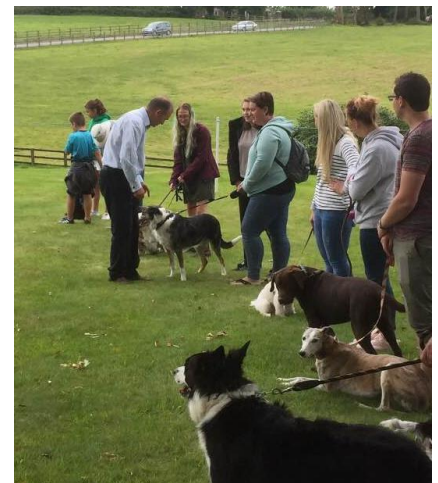
Helped welcome a family of Syrian refugees to their new home in Narberth - **Croeso Arberth** has done a fantastic job in raising the funds needed to support the group.

Welcomed the news that Carmarthenshire County Council is taking steps to deal with vandalism, illegal fly tipping and camping at **Morfa Bychan beach near Pendine** which was ruining The National Trust beach.

Enjoyed the annual spectacle that is **IronMan Wales in Tenby**. 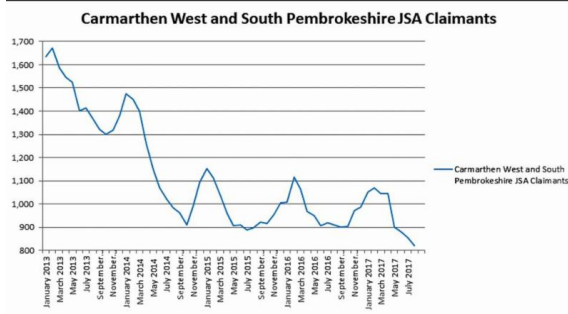

In Westminster I have:

Been voted on to the **Select Committee for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport** and am looking forward to the wide-ranging investigations that we will be carrying out from broadband and mobile coverage to fake news and misuse of social media.



Welcomed the latest unemployment figures (*pic left*) which reveal that **unemployment is at its lowest level since 1975** and full time employment is at a new record high.

Joined 212 of my colleagues, across all parties, signing a letter to the Prime Minister **calling for an energy price cap** to protect the 17 million families who are currently on expensive Standard Variable Tariff deals. We were delighted that the Prime Minister announced this in her conference speech and are expecting a draft Bill in the very near future.

Been appointed by the **Prime Minister to the Committee for Standards in Public Life** and our first inquiry is into the intimidation of parliamentary candidates, volunteers and the public during General Elections. This is an important issue, affecting many people around the country, and on which I secured a Parliamentary debate before the summer recess.

Signed up to **pledge my support for British Farming**, especially in light of leaving Europe, via the National Farmers' Union 'Back British Farming' campaign (*pic right*).
